

## Sample Structured Document

---

**Introduction** This format shows what a structured modular document looks like.

---

**Description** Each module includes independent “bits” of information, and requires a “byte” format/structure before one publishes the document.

---

**Definition** A “byte” is a minimum group of modules formatted as a publishable document.

A byte includes a title and at least two “bits” of information,

- One bit is the “Introduction” that orients the user to the document’s
  - purpose,
  - source, *or*
  - content of the document.
- Other bits include support information for different fields, such as:
  - action,
  - situation,
  - concept,
  - construct,
  - process,
  - fact, *or*
  - metaconcept.

---

**Examples** The “Definition” bit is an example of a bit that supports the “concept” field, by telling the reader what something is or is not.

The “Description” bit is an example of a bit that supports the “construct” field, by telling the reader what something looks like.
