

Fishbone Diagram — Worksheet

Description

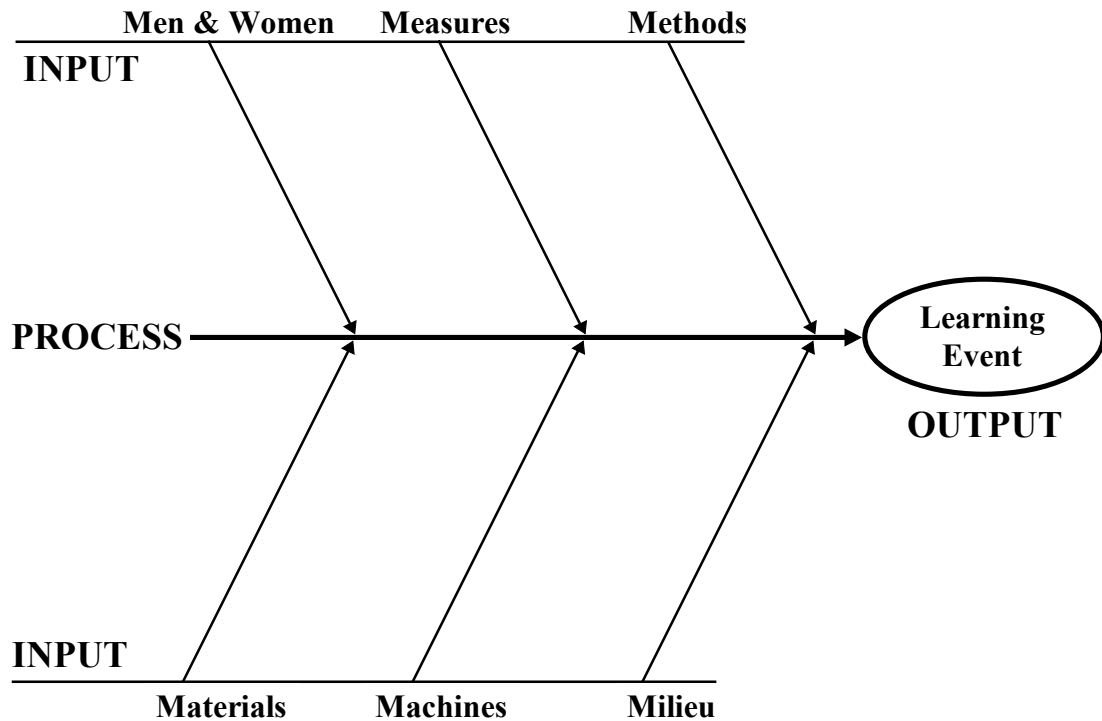
Ishikawa’s fishbone is one of four copies of a diagram that displays the skeleton resources you need to manage any process.

These six resource categories have tags that all begin with “M” so users can recall them more easily.

This diagram is based on the Input-Process-Output model. It shows the six resource categories that provide *input* to the *process* of managing learning to create an *output* for the learner: a state of conscious competence.

This diagram shows only the backbone, ribs, and head of the fishbone.

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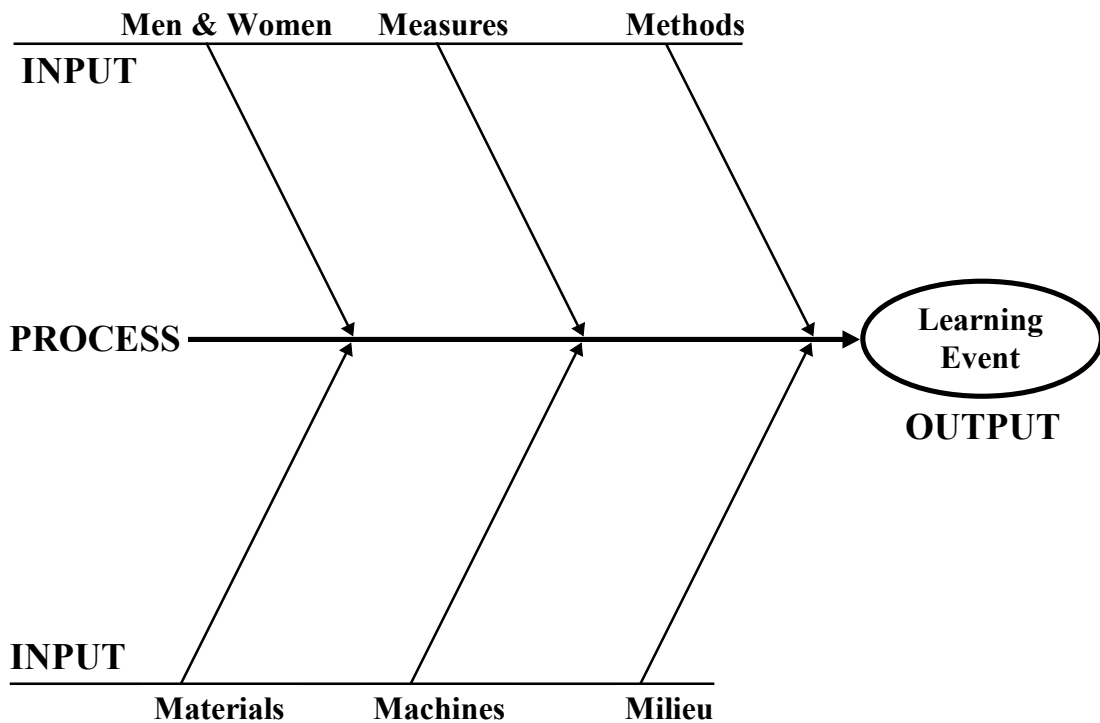
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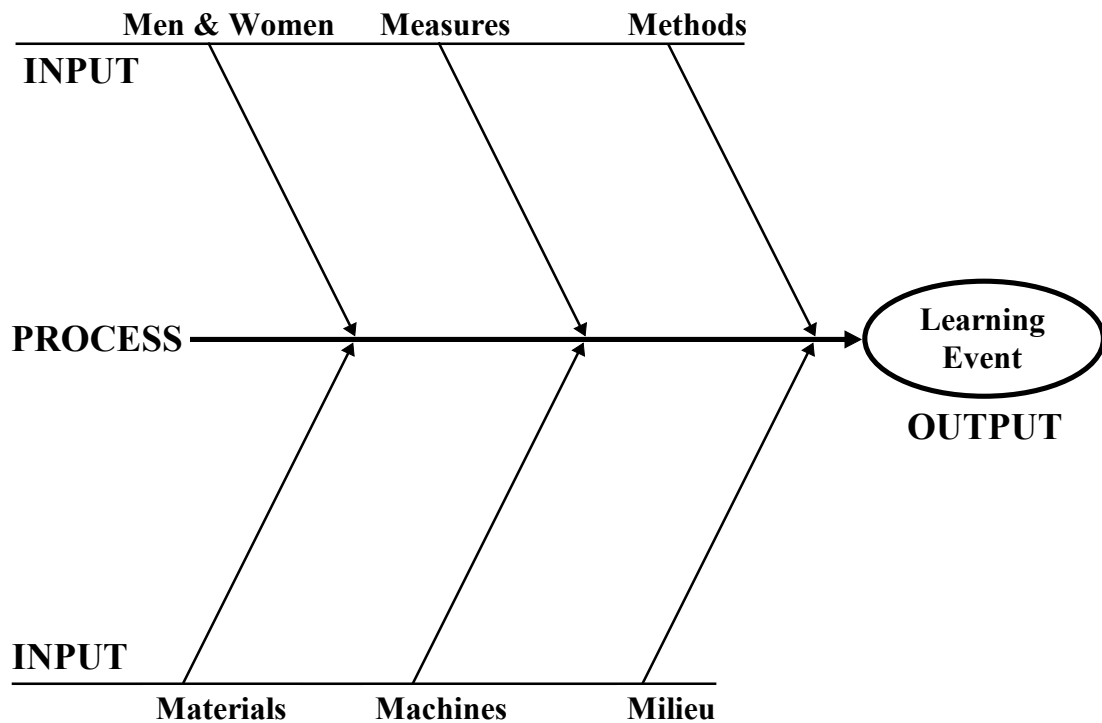
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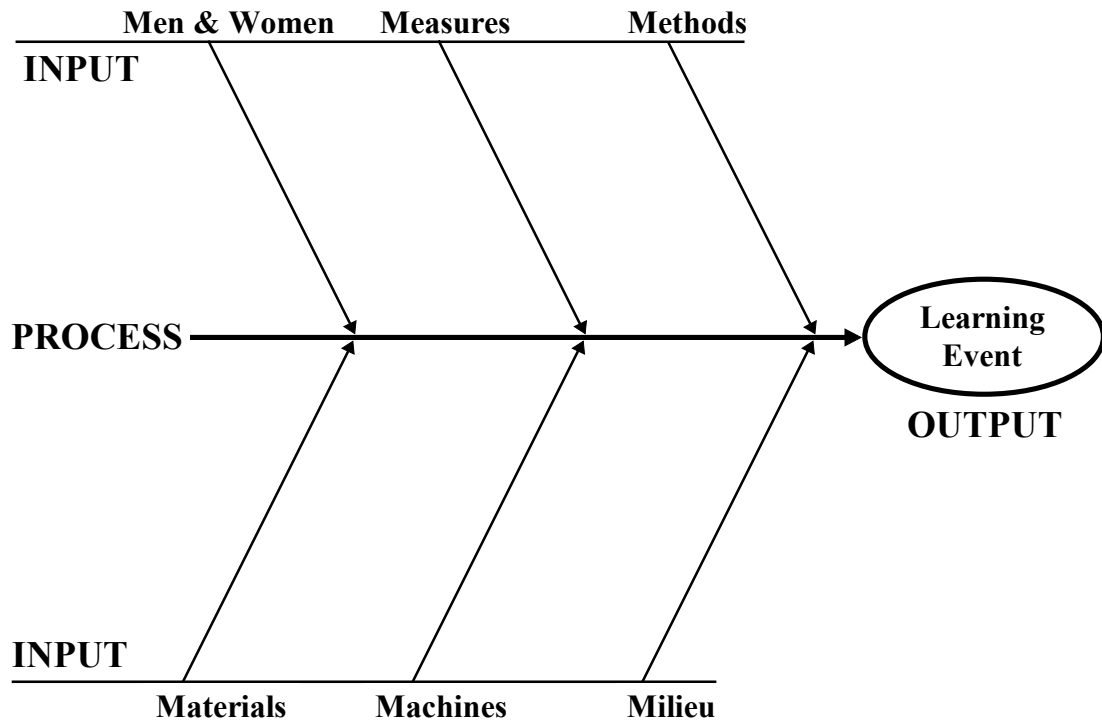
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
